- Case management for 177 Diversion and 209 Aftercare members

Going to church camp is one thing many of our youth look forward to in the summer. ## From the Parrish Nurse

Did you know ...

The Parish Nurse ministry here at CIUMC has a loaner program for adaptive health equipment. Because of the generosity of some of our congregation, currently and in the past, we have a variety of health-related pieces of equipment to loan for short periods of time. Two of our newest pieces of equipment were purchased in February with money acquired from a grant sometime back. We are excited to be able to add these items. It is the first purchase ever made for the ministry.

Our inventory of equipment includes wheelchairs, bedside commodes, bath chairs, walkers, rollators, canes, crutches and more.

The process for signing out one of those items is as follows: Call or come into the office during the week Monday through Thursday. Tell us what you need, and one of the office staff will help you find a suitable piece, if we have it. The borrower and the staff will bring the item to the office where the office staff will sign it out on the equipment sign out clipboard.

It is helpful to have the borrower's name and phone number on file. Sometimes a borrower forgets to return it. When forgetting happens, another potential borrower is unable to get the equipment they are now in need of.

Our loaner program is used very often. We are pleased to be able to provide this very helpful, convenient and money-saving service/ministry.

When a piece of equipment has been out on loan for a while we may call to see if it is still in use or if the borrower just forgot to bring it back.

\*\* If you are a borrower, either for yourself, a family member or a friend and still have it but are no longer using it, please return it at your earliest convenience. It would be very helpful to let us know by phone if you have had an item for a while and it is still in use. We are missing at least 2 items that are very popular loaner items. Thank you in advance for checking.

Along with the care that we all give daily and beyond, one of those areas of caring ministry is the Congregational Care Committee that is responsible for specific, individual acts of caring and kindness and help.

Our church ministries at CIUMC are welcoming. The ministries within the Congregational Care Committee currently include visiting our folks who are homebound and those who want or need support. This last Christmas we had a card shower that was well received by the many givers and recipients. Calling people who are acutely ill and, in the hospital, or having surgery is another one of our major points of care.

Many of our areas of ministry overlap with our Parish Nurse program. We have been an active group for about a year. There is a lot of growth that we hope for in our future. We meet quarterly to check in, for ideas of help and support from each other and for each other. At each meeting, and often in between meetings, we informally discuss new or continuing projects, caring and change of status for one of our congregants.

We are always open to suggestions to reach out in other ways. Please feel free to share your thoughts with us.

## **Courtyard Update**

As you may remember, the Trustees approved a plan to redesign the courtyard, replacing the invasive plants with plants native to Indiana that support the members of God's creation that live here. The invasive ivy and vinca were removed, and native shrubby St John's wort and a button bush were planted in the fall. The remaining wildflowers have been ordered and will be planted in the spring.

Great news! The Indiana Native Plant Society awarded us a \$300 grant, the maximum amount, to help fund this project!

## **Progress!**

Progress! This past month, I have been working on what we call "Check Day". No, it is not about writing checks or calling someone to check-in on them. It is known by UMC church administrators as crunch time- we are looking at the past year- in numbers. Lots of numbers. We report numbers such as giving, giving units, how much we sent to UMCOR, how much we sent to non-UMC ministries, average attendance, how many members we have gained, lost, etc. So this involves running many reports and some spreadsheets. These numbers are entered into a system, accepted and then given to The General Conference on Finance and Administration. These numbers are then public knowledge and are used as official tracking of our church. This is the second year that I have completed all of the numbers for reporting process. I would say we are making progress. Pastor Greg asked me what my thoughts were on the numbers and I said "potential." Last year, with all we had been thru we had an increase in giving- even without the financial gift. We didn't increase in a lot of areas, but what I saw was potential for growth. That we reach over 12,000 every year with our ministries- food pantry, vbs, trunk or treat and more! How powerful is that! We make a difference in our community! And I am grateful that God has placed me in a church that cares! -Terri Haehnle
